



# Fisher Meadows

## Where:

Located in southeast Avon, west of Waterville Road along Old Farms Road.

## How to get there:

Waterville Road (Route 10) to Old Farms Road. Parking Area 0.2 mi. on right. (Main entrance)  
- OR -  
Old Farms Road - Parking area 0.2 mi. south of Country Club Rd. (North entrance)

## Features:

Mix of forest and field areas  
Flat, easy walking and biking  
Fishing, canoeing, and birdwatching  
Long trail along Farmington River  
Interpretive signage around Spring Lake  
Connection to Fisher Farms trails to the south



## GPS directions:

Search for 775 Old Farms Road, Avon, CT (Main entrance)  
- OR -  
350 Old Farms Road, Avon, CT (North entrance)

Size: 205 acres

The majority of the Fisher Meadows Natural Area was gifted to the Town of Avon by the Stanley D. Fisher Family in 1976 and the park was established in 1977.

1935 airphotos of the area show that much more of Fisher Meadows was open at that time (and presumably used for agriculture) compared to present conditions. This suggests that portions of the property have reforested following agricultural abandonment sometime in the early-to-mid 20th Century.


The most distinctive elements of Fisher Meadows include a very long frontage along the Farmington River, an intricate mix of water, fields, and forests, very flat topography, and a wide range of community uses.

Fisher Meadows has opportunities for hiking, biking, fishing, canoeing, and picnicking. The property also contains playing fields for active recreation sports.

Public facilities at Fisher Meadows are limited to seasonal port-o-lets.
